We're hugely impressed by Titebond Extend for laminating. Something we've been using recently in the workshops.

So much easier and nicer to use than those old laminating favourites, urea formaldehyde (UF) and epoxy.

Ready mixed, a nice long open-time and apparently a glue line that is stiffer than a 'D3' crosslinking PVA. Give it a whirl and let us know how you get on.
